Happy New Year! Welcome to 2018! We are all looking forward to a brand new year working together on lots of exciting topics.

English

In English, we are learning how to develop creative writing skills in fictional stories, studying stories with familiar settings and exploring the features of report writing, letters, instructions and persuasive texts, as well as promoting grammar, spelling and punctuation during every lesson.

Mathematics

In Maths, we are learning about the skills involved in calculating using the 4 operations. We will also work through activities in place value, data-handling and fractions as well as combining these skills in real-life and word problems. Times tables will be learnt on a weekly basis.

Science

In Science, we are studying Forces and Magnets. We will be investigating magnets and what materials are attracted or repelled. We will explore how things move on different surfaces. We will also complete work on Animals to link with our visit to Rand Farm.

R.E

In R.E, we are exploring Incarnation. We will be learning about Gospels and the letters found in the New Testament, and discuss what texts about baptism and the Trinity might mean.

Computing

In Computing, we are learning about how to stay safe when using the internet and studying "We are Opinion Pollsters." This involves creating an online survey, carrying it out and then analysing the data by making graphs.

PSHE

In PSHE, we are learning about 'Dreams and Goals' and 'Healthy Me' in our Jigsaw programme of work.

P.E

With our sports teachers, we will be focusing on dance and netball.

International Primary Curriculum

We learn these subjects through our theme. For our themes we have an entry day to enthuse the children and an exit day to celebrate all that we have learned.

Our theme is Young Entrepreneurs.
